Enjoy an outing through beautiful countryside



The Wey & Arun Canal is ideal for canoeists, kayakers and paddleboarders who enjoy quiet waters in a rural location.

The restored canal in West Sussex runs through beautiful countryside, from near Billingshurst, through Loxwood, and up towards the Surrey border.

There are landing stages and various access points along this stretch of the waterway. British Canoeing members can use the 3½-mile navigable section of Loxwood Link and other sections which become available as restoration progresses, without charge. For others, a day licence costs £5 and an annual licence £15. Special rates are available for groups such as Scouts and Guides. Please email us for details (see below). Licence fees can be paid via our website or at Loxwood Canal Centre. Conditions apply.


The canal and the Canal Trust

The Wey & Arun Canal was built between 1813 and 1816 and formed part of an inland route between London and Portsmouth. The canal closed in 1871. Since 1970 the Wey & Arun Canal Trust has been working to preserve and improve the canal route for the benefit of everyone. We are a volunteer-led organisation and we get no regular financial support from the government or any other public sources. Where to launch on the Loxwood Link



We welcome canoes, kayaks, paddleboards and other unpowered craft to the fully navigable canal section at Loxwood in West Sussex. If you are planning to bring a group to the canal, it will be very helpful if you contact us beforehand. We recommend that all boaters call in at our Loxwood Canal Centre if it is open or phone (01403 753999) to check what boat trips are operating. At times, low water levels or maintenance work may mean that some sections are not available.
