Thursday and Sunday Group

Pollowing completion of the bridge parapets at Gennets Bridge Lock (GBL) in June they were given a thorough washing. Then the scaffolding, at that end of the lock, could be removed and returned to Tickner's Heath.

Meanwhile the bricklaying continued at the far end of the lock and started on the top sill. By the end of the month the progress was such that some of the copings at the off-side top sill could be cast. The newt pond we dug earlier is flourishing with all sorts of life. The bank behind it is to provide infill when the lock wall copings are cast.

Despite deliveries of towpath materials not occurring as ordered we managed to keep both bridleways open while doing the changes to the surface. Eventually the towpath was brought up to the bridge deck height and, with WSCC permission, the temporary diversion over the causeway was closed. The landowner, horse riders, a motorist and pedestrians were all highly delighted with the bridge and its ambiance.

After a 'round robin' fundraising exercise, £5244 was raised from well wishers for the ground paddles and they were bought as funds allowed. The sluices have been fitted to the top sill of the lock during the past month.

The digging out of the winding hole has continued at a lower level (both work rate and topographical) and really needs to be completed by the end of August. Recently, after a months rainfall in a day, things became very sticky and provided an early warning. Fortunately the air temperature is up and the ground is drying out quite quickly; this will not be the case in September unless we get another Indian summer, so fingers crossed.

They had managed to wrench said rake from its housing in the stop plank shelter, so the securing device was replaced and another keb fitted. The last Wednesday of the month saw us decamping to the Gun's Mouth to transport a load of unwanted junk, sorry stores, from Bridge End to the shared shed at the canal side. The weather was against us, damp and miserable, but the task was completed. We also managed to increase John Piper's knowledge of Trust geography.

Summit (Northern) Working Party

Ashort report this month as your correspondent has shamefully failed to attend a single working day during the month of July so the contents are very much second hand.

The major (and on- going) operation has been the dismantling of the site compound at Compasses and its move to the slipway area. It was November 2014 when we arrived on site and started to erect the timber hoarding around the perimeter of what has been our home for two years and eight months. The compound has been essential to the successful outcome of the project. It has been a step change in the way volunteers have operated on the canal and all the Trust's larger projects can expect to have such a facility .

The major part of the move was on 19th July when the regular team had the assistance of a hired flat bed truck with Hiab crane, a small telehandler and the Trust's Land Rover and trailer. The truck moved the containers and site office and much of the other heavy equipment (fuel stores etc) – eight trips were involved. Thanks to the team who worked into the early evening to break the back of the job.

A new Summit WP base has now sprung up at the top of the road leading down to the proposed slipway – our next project due for completion Spring 2018. Space is much more limited here but no doubt we will manage.
