Thursday and Sunday Group

We were amazed, some of the horse fraternity are calling the bridge at GBL 'Tilly's Bridge' because Tilly was the first horse across it; all part of the ups and downs of project work.

During August we had a visit by the senior officer for Natural England in Kent and Sussex with a group of five of his team members, including two trainees. They were "Really impressed with the works the Trust have undertaken and pleased with the newt solutions you implemented." They recommend for the future: "An organisation license which could be considered for the Trust ... which would allow future works to take place where newts exists in return for building in a strategy for newts into the work plans supporting the delivery of positive habitat creation and management which would support the key needs of newts in this landscape." That's all good news for the Trust where at GBL using the site licence system, which was the only one available at the time, cost £20k and a delay of two years.

August saw the bricklaying in the lock almost completed and casting the copings well in hand. As for the winding hole, it is as complete as it needs to be at this stage of the project.

Preparations to clear the site are in hand and the purchase of the four different grass seed mixes will go forward shortly. The biggest quantity of seed is for wetland meadow, which the site is, being at the bottom of a field with a clay subsurface. The others are pond surround mix, for

just that, clay meadow (around the winding hole) and hard wearing (around the lock). What the TSG has to do now is clear the ground, cabins, concrete etc and cover it with top soil if required and till it, ready for the grass. To keep the Hedging Group happy the 771 hedging plants, for 134m of new hedge, have been ordered for delivery in November.

As part of the hibernacula, now taking shape on the site close to the bridge, it is hoped to introduce some insect hotels.

We are still recycling car batteries, give us a call if you have one. And the sale of logs is going well too, just a few left.

Mid-Week Working Party

August has been a busy month for our working party with record numbers attending on some weeks and very low numbers on others due to the different weather conditions

We have had three separate weeks at Loxwood clearing the canal of timber and reeds as far as the slipway at Drungewick, the towpath of brambles and weeds and also worked on the car park at Loxwood. This should make it easier for boats to navigate and the punters to have a better view as well as making the area look much tidier. In between we have been back to Hunt Park where

we took out more bricks from Gosden Aqueduct from Cranleigh Waters, ground down a large trunk to clear the end of the aqueduct, cleared a great deal of Himalayan Balsam and reseeded one of the Cranleigh river banks where flood repair had been completed.

We have also been back to Haybarn where some of the group reduced the height of 50 yards of a hedge to 5ft 6 in. This job is made more difficult by most branches having to be lopped as they are very thick because it has been left far too long. Others in the group continued to clear the base of the canal and banks. Eventually we will clear the whole length between Haybarn and Harsfold bridge. We are back to Haybarn to do our annual clear up next month

On 7 August we gave four of our regular sites a real 'going over'. In addition to the usual mowing and strimming, at the Drungewick aqueduct site, we repaired and modified the gate to the Roger Dimmock lane to prevent it being lifted off its hinges again by future miscreants; at Loxwood we cleared the ditch at the bottom of the canal bank and cut the overflow car park and kept up appearances at Devil's Hole and Southland locks. We have been asked to 'look after' Gennets Bridge lock and its immediate environment too when Eric and his team move off site.

At the request of the landowner and working in co-operation with MWWP, on the 21st, eight of us spent all day at Haybarn continuing cutting and trimming the hedge south of the swing bridge (as well as doing our usual tidying up around the swing bridge). This hedge has grown too high and is in real need of TLC. So far both groups have now made one visit each and between us we reckon some 85 yards has received a haircut. It is going to be quite a task to complete it as far as the Lee Farm causeway.

We meet again on 4 September and 18 September when we will need to visit our regular sites to 'keep up appearances'.
